TREATY OF WAITANGI POLICY

1 Rationale

The Treaty of Waitangi acknowledges Maaori as Tangata Whenua (local indigenous people) of Aotearoa New Zealand.

The Curriculum acknowledges the Principles of the Treaty of Waitangi also referred to as the 3 P's: **Partnership, Protection and Participation.**

All staff and students have the opportunity to acquire knowledge of Te Reo Maaori me ona Tikanga.

2 Purpose

- 2.1 To understand, experience and appreciate Tikanga Maaori, values and attitudes.
- 2.2 To incorporate Tikanga Maaori perspectives as an integral part of the school programme.
- 2.3 To support Maaori in their right to their own Tikanga (cultural practice.)
- 2.4 To develop Tikanga awareness, knowledge and understanding so that custom and values are appreciated.

3 Guidelines and Procedures

- 3.1 The school will make full use of the Maaori resources and personnel in the community.
- 3.2 Provisions will be made for the purchase and maintenance of suitable physical and human resources for the teaching of Tikanga Maaori.
- 3.3 Staff will follow the Tikanga and Kawa (customs and protocols) of Tainui iwi (tribe Tainui is the tribe of this area.)

4 Conclusion

We will work towards the recognition and promotion of a Maaori perspective in our school and provide programmes that help the students and staff to value and understand the Maaori culture across the curriculum areas.
